In ancient Rome, corruption among women was rampant. In India, there was great discrimination against women and they were considered second - class citizens. Likewise, in Japan men held extensive authority over women. Women had no right to inherit property. Although Greece, from the educational and social points

of view, was considered a more advanced nation, women were still living in desperate conditions and were deprived of their legitimate rights. These were the circumstances of most women in the world before Islam. Today, howerer many women still do not enjoy better conditions. It is claimed in many societies that women have equal rights in all aspects of life, but in reality the reverse is often true. Women were often considered as mere property in old civilizations and now not much has changed. In the name of freedom and equality, men exploit woman's physical nature for sexual pleasure and under the pretext of giving women the status they deserve, further degrade her.
